The park's historic chapel will be brought back into use as a venue. Work to restore the interior of the Chapel will include a new floor, new toilet facilities, electricity, lighting, and new seating at balcony level.

The Café

An environmentally-friendly heat pump will be installed in the park to provide heat and hot water to the new buildings.

We are creating a new accessible entrance on Church Street to make it easier for wheelchair-users and buggies to access the site.
